Understand Your Risk

-Impact Analysis

Determine how a hurricane may impact your organization

-Vulnerability Analysis

Determine your vulnerabilities to a large scale disaster

-Mitigation Strategy

Develop strategies to minimize risk exposure and address capability gaps





Review Your Insurance and Emergency Funding

-Insurance Review

Review your insurance policies to determine what disaster related impacts may be covered and what potential costs may not be covered

-Emergency Funding

Consider having emergency funds available to meet unexpected disaster related expenses





Review and Update Your Emergency Plan

-It is critical to have an updated emergency plan in place long before the arrival of a hurricane

-Your emergency plan should provide clear guidance on actions to take before, during, and after a disaster

-Ensure your emergency plan is easy to understand and a practical resource for your team during stressful disaster situations





Team Involvement

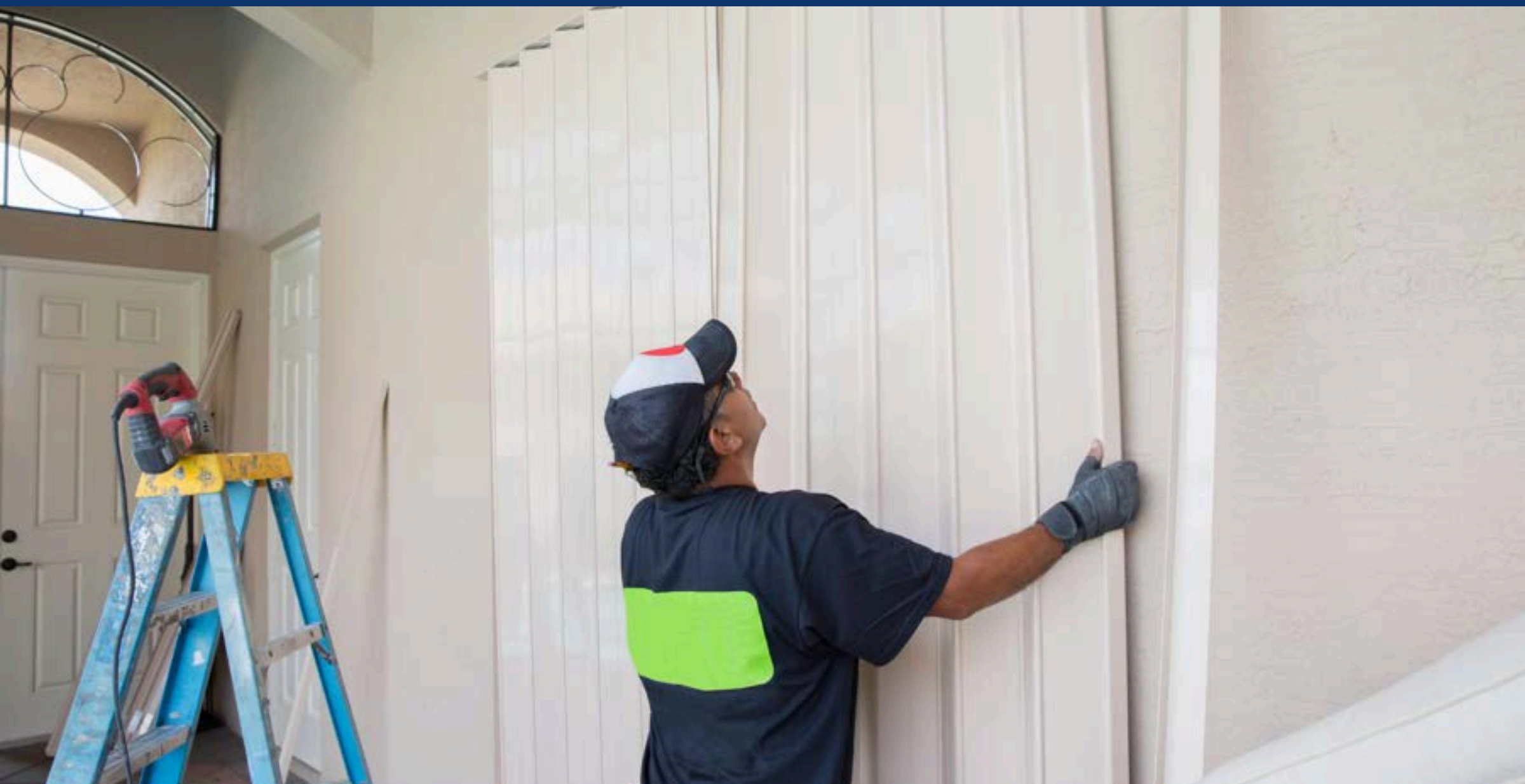
- Engage your team in the development of the emergency plan
- Ensure every team member understands their assigned roles and responsibilities in the emergency plan and that they receive training on their disaster-related tasks
- Involving team members in the preparedness process fosters a sense of value and better equips them to assist the organization during a disaster





Readiness At Home

- Team members who are prepared for a disaster at home are more likely to be ready to assist your organization during a crisis
- Consider providing training for team members on how to effectively prepare their families for a disaster
- Prioritize the safety and well-being of team members by determining their status during a disaster and identifying ways the organization can support their disaster-related needs





Protect Your Data

- Ensure your critical data remains accessible during a disaster
- Consider utilizing a secure offsite data storage solution that will not be impacted by a regional disaster
- Ensure multiple team members have access to the organization's critical data storage and can access it remotely





Effective Communications

- Include communication procedures in your emergency plan that address the needs of internal and external stakeholders

- Designate who in the organization will be responsible for communicating with external stakeholders and define the key messages to convey

- Establish how your organization will communicate internally during an emergency





Coordinate With Your Vendors

- Ensure that your vendors, suppliers, and other critical partners are also prepared for a disaster
- Determine what services, supplies and equipment that are vital to maintain your critical operations
- Ensure your vendors, suppliers and other critical partners are included in your disaster preparedness efforts





Coordinate With Your Community

-Coordinate with your local elected officials and your local Emergency Management Office for up to date information on community emergency response and disaster recovery efforts

-Coordinate with local officials and other organizations in your community to determine how your organization may assist in local disaster recovery efforts





Test Your Plan

-It is crucial that your emergency plan is regularly tested to ensure its effectiveness and determine the readiness of your team to perform their assigned roles

-Organizations should consider conducting regular exercises that include both internal and external stakeholders

-Exercises will greatly enhance an organization's ability to overcome the challenges of a future disaster
